Lay Ministry service, Lincoln Cathedral

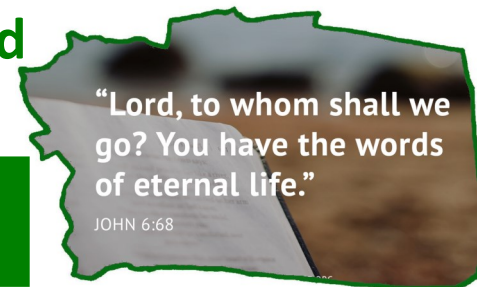

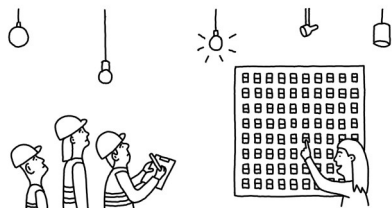
Some of our churchwardens were unable to attend the service held in June at Lincoln cathedral. Therefore they will be admitted at the following services:
