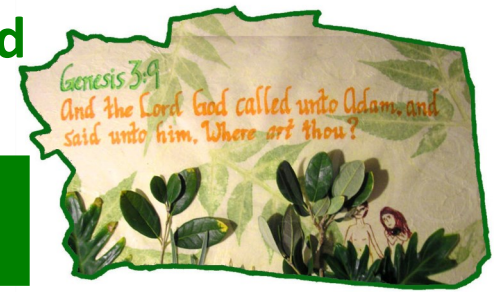
Give us your time
