This week a survey for everyone who visits a church in the Diocese of Lincoln will be launched, inviting everyone to take part in a TTCT survey. By everyone this includes, PCC members, worshippers, people who go to church groups, and even those who just pop in for coffee mornings.

This survey has been commissioned by the Ven Aly Buxton (in her capacity as Director of RSC), and is part of ongoing research into TTCT, "Church culture" and their effect on one another. It has been created with a dual purpose; firstly, to allow individuals to voice their opinions, thereby contributing to the shaping of long-term strategy, and secondly, to enable the TTCT implementation team to:

1. Better understand the concerns, aspirations and priorities of the constituent communities of our diocese, and among these to identify regional, ecclesial, and demographic characteristics.
2. Make data-rich and evidence-based decisions.
3. Establish a baseline from which progress can be measured.


Saying Goodbye Service - 20th November at 6.30pm, in Ely Cathedral


